***Localizing the Global Agenda on Development Cooperation: Regional dimensions in strengthening Mutual Accountability***

Mutual Accountability plays a significant role in strengthening partnerships within partner countries and between partner countries and their development partners towards improving development outcomes. It also sets strong a framework for monitoring the effective utilisation of development resources. Accountability shapes the quality of governance system in advancing development effectiveness.
