The partners in the MARC project are EDCTP (The European & Developing Countries Clinical Trials Partnership), COHRED (the Council on Health Research for Development) and the University of Johannesburg (UJ) - in particular, the South African Research Ethics Training Initiative (SARETI) located in the School of Psychology of the UJ-ZIN in Pietermaritzburg, South Africa.

The MARC project links the 'ethics review capacity' and 'ethics review capacity building initiatives' with COHRED's Health Research Web platform (HRWeb). This allows for ethics capacity analysis in relation to general research system development, encourages comparisons between countries inside and outside Africa, and facilitates sustainability and knowledge sharing throughout the project.

- **Definition :** This survey follows the approach of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), which defines Research and Experimental Development (R&D) as:
 - Research is creative work and original investigation undertaken on a systematic basis to gain new knowledge, including knowledge of humanity, culture and society.
 - Development is the application of research findings or other scientific knowledge for the creation of new or significantly improved products, applications or processes.
- The basic criterion for distinguishing R&D from related activities is the presence in R&D of an appreciable element of novelty and the resolution of scientific and/or technological uncertainty, i.e. when the solution to a problem is not readily apparent to someone familiar with the basic stock of commonly used knowledge and techniques in the area concerned.

Question 5 - HEAD COUNTS, FULL-TIME EQUIVALENTS (FTEs) AND LABOUR COSTS OF R&D PERSONNEL

Provide an estimate of Person Years of effort on R&D (or Full-Time Equivalents), according to the categories below.

CALCULATING 'FULL TIME EQUIVALENT' (FTE) PERSONS

Note: For the purpose of this survey, an employee can only work a maximum of FTE in a year. (FTE is the proportion of time spent on R & D expressed as percentage). For example, a full time employee spending 40% of his/her time on R&D during half of the survey year would contribute $0.4 \times 0.5 = 0.2$ FTE to the R&D effort, even if his/her average time per week was, for example 60 hours. A part-time employee working 40% of a full time year doing only R&D would contribute 0.4 FTE to the R&D effort.

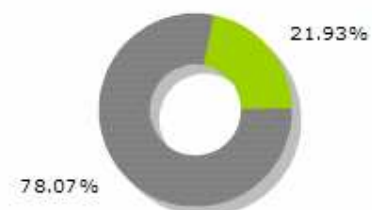

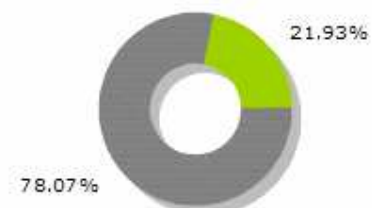
